



Cadet Scholars

- ★ *Raymond R. Foltz of South Carolina was one of only five civil engineering students nationwide to be awarded a National Defense Science and Engineering Graduate (NSDEG) Fellowship. The \$150,000 award will allow Cadet Foltz to pursue his doctorate degree in structural engineering at the University of Illinois.*
- ★ *Patrick C. Reilly of New York was named a Fullbright Scholar and will study initiatives in electronic government, known as e-government, in the country of New Zealand. Following his Fullbright study, Reilly will enroll in the master of engineering program in computer science at Cornell University. Reilly, a computer science major at The Citadel, hopes his research will advance governmental use of technology in the United States.*
- ★ *Another Fullbright Scholar, Carter L. Palmer of Connecticut received his award to pursue research at the Ludwig Maximilian University in Munich. He will examine the security role of the socialist Soldiers' Councils in the Bavarian Republic of 1918-1919. Palmer majored in history with a minor in German and is the fifth cadet in four years to receive a Fullbright award to study in Germany.*
- ★ *The Citadel's cadet team of Shawna Hartman (Colorado), Kevin Young (South Carolina), Jui Chaiang Chen (Taiwan), and Pisuit Muangsamai (Thailand) placed first out of almost 50 other college teams at the 29th Annual Society for Industrial and Applied Mathematics Southeast Atlantic Section (SIAM-SEAS) math jeopardy contest. Hartman and Chen are math majors; Young and Muangsamai are physics majors.*
- ★ *The Citadel chapter of the National Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi recently celebrated its 26th anniversary by initiating 56 new undergraduate members. Phi Kappa Phi is a scholarly, multidisciplinary society with undergraduate membership reserved for the top 7.5% of the junior class and 8% of the senior class.*
