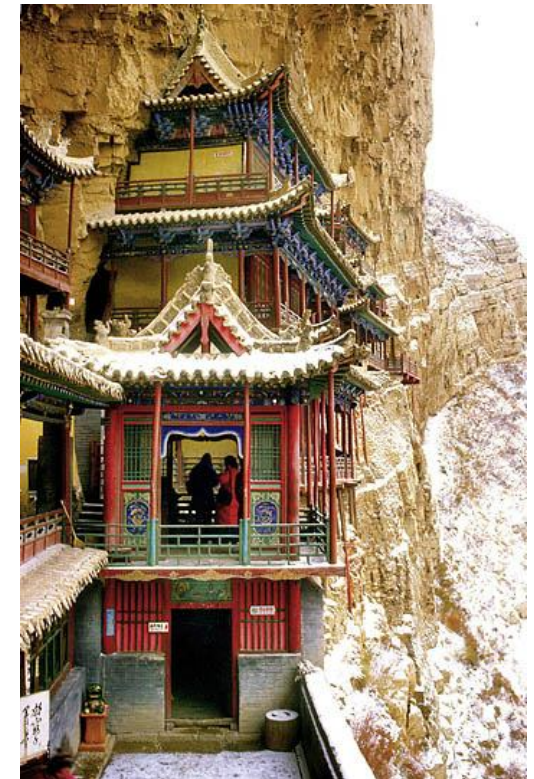

- To make Chinese history real by walking through time.

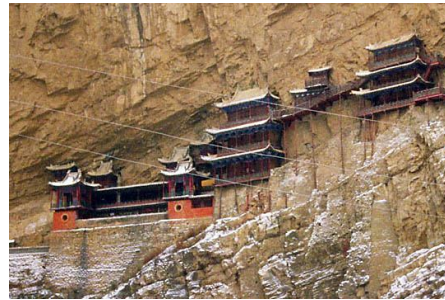
## ITINERARY

May 11	Arrive Beijing; Take a night train to Huhehaote City, Inner Mongolia
May 12	Huhehaote City: Daozhao Temple; explore prairie, and visit herdsman families, watch horse racing, and sleep in a yurt, etc.
May 13	Visit the Provincial Museum in Huhehaote
May 14	Travel to Datong City, visit the Huayan Temple, the Yungang Grottoes, and the municipal museum
May 15	Travel to Mt. Wutai. Tour the "Suspended in Air" Temple and the Ying County Wooden Pagoda
May 16/25	Take classes at Shanxi University,
May 26/27	Beijing: Tour the Forbidden City, National Grand Theater, National Stadium (The Bird's Nest), the Great Wall, the Summer Palace, and the Temple of Heaven
May 28	Leave Beijing

## MULTI-DISCIPLINARY STUDIES

This educational opportunity is provided by The Citadel's History Department. Dr. Keith Knapp (History) will lead the learning activities associated with this study. **Three (3) hours of applicable undergraduate or graduate credit** may be earned by satisfying the following:

- Maintain a daily journal of activities and reflections
- Read the assigned texts
- Complete a topical/research study of approximately 10 pages
- Write two short reports on a specific artifact and site



Each student will study various aspects of Chinese history, culture, art, and society. Recommended topics for study include:

- China and its northern neighbors
- Northern China's cultural and social history
- China's religious traditions and practices
- Historical material culture and architecture



## GAIN HISTORICAL AND GLOBAL PERSPECTIVES

Gain historical and global perspectives by experiencing Chinese historical and cultural accomplishments. Planned activities include:

- A day on the inner Mongolian steppe
- Visits to historical sites, ancient buildings, and a vinegar factory
- Chinese language training, lectures on Chinese history, philosophy and art, and a hands-on calligraphy class
- The Shanxi provincial museum, the walled city of Pingyao, and the Wang and Qiao family mansions
- Two full days touring Beijing
